FOR FURNITURE DESIGNER NICKI HUGGINS, THE PAST IS HER PRESENT.

In her north Florida design studio, Retropatio, Nicki Huggins artfully restores vintage metal gliders, rockers and chairs for those seeking a nostalgic touch for their outdoor spaces.

Huggins finds the blank canvases for her imagination in forgotten steel furniture, especially that made in the first half of the 20th century by two now-defunct manufacturers, Howell Manufacturing and the J.R. Bunting Company.

"The reason the furniture is still here is a testament to the quality of the American steel used at that time, plus the weatherability of the designs themselves," Huggins says. "For instance, the gliders often have cutout motifs in the bench, which allow water to drip through and not collect on the seats."

After retrofitting with new hanging straps and stainless-steel hardware, the pieces are sandblasted and powder-coated in one of 400 custom finishes.

Then Huggins adds a fresh twist with contemporary outdoor retroations.
